Sabbatical FAQ's:

1. Is this sabbatical so that Pastor Austin can research, write, or produce something?

While there are sabbaticals in the academic world that are geared toward research or writing projects, this pastoral sabbatical is aimed at providing Pastor Austin with the time and space he needs to recharge his mental, physical, and spiritual batteries. That means his focus will be on rest and renewal.

2. Has Pastor Austin been here long enough to take a sabbatical; didn't he just start working at RPC last month?

Time sure does fly. Pastor Austin began his time at RPC in 2017 and as he has now completed 7+ years of service our RPC sabbatical policy allows for this leave at this time.

3. When Pastor Austin is on sabbatical, how can I reach him?

The short answer is you won't be able to reach him during his sabbatical. During this time away Pastor Austin will not be checking or responding to his work email address. He also won't be available by phone or text message. To maximize his time away and truly unplug from work he will be completely away during this time.

4. What if I have an important question or issue and I need the pastor's help?

While Pastor Austin is away Austin Rehbein will be available to support RPC with pastoral care issues.
